Q.1 Tax avoidance is the use of legal loopholes to alter a person or company's financial position in order to lower the amount of tax that they are obliged to pay. This differs from tax evasion where a person or organisation does not pay tax by illegal methods. Between 2009 and 2011, Npower, the energy company did not pay corporation tax in the UK. In the same period Npower customers experienced price rises and Npower's profits increased. Npower's 2012 accounts have not yet been published. Now that you know that Npower is involved in legal tax avoidance, are you more likely or less likely to consider Npower as a potential energy supplier in the future, or does it make no difference to you?
