

# BBC Newsbeat – Crime and Punishment Survey: Adults aged 18-30

#### METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 1,002 GB adults aged 18-30 by telephone between 14<sup>th</sup> February and 4<sup>th</sup> March 2014. Data were weighted to be representative of all GB adults aged 18-30. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
