#### **METHODOLOGY NOTE**

ComRes interviewed 535 adults online from 18<sup>th</sup> January to 4<sup>th</sup> February 2013. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all UK practicing Christians. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
