#### **METHODOLOGY NOTE**

ComRes interviewed 2,043 British adults, including 606 homeowners with a mortgage, online between 31st January and 2nd February 2014. Data were weighted to be representative of all GB adults aged 18+. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
