METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 500 adults in Doncaster North parliamentary constituency by telephone from 22nd to 30th October 2012. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all Doncaster adults aged 18+. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
