### **METHODOLOGY NOTE**

ComRes interviewed 2,059 British adults online between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> April 2013. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all British adults aged 18+. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
