METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 6,144 adults online between 16th to 25th January 2013. This included 508 respondents from ethnic minorities. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all British adults aged 18+. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.

All press releases or other publications must be checked with ComRes before use. ComRes requires 48 hours to check a press release unless otherwise agreed.
