METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 1751 adults in Norfolk by telephone between 17th and 22nd February 2011. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of Norfolk adults according to the most recent population estimates from the Office of National Statistics (ONS).
