#### **METHODOLOGY NOTE**

ComRes interviewed 2,045 GB adults online between the 16th and 17th May 2018. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all GB adults by age, gender, region and social grade. Data were also weighted by past vote recall and likelihood to vote. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.






