Methodology: Savanta ComRes interviewed 501 residents of Greater Manchester who will be eligible to vote in the May 2020 mayoral elections from the 27th January to 14th February 2020. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of Greater Manchester by age, gender, social grade and sub-region.
