METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 1,001 GB adults by telephone between 21st and 23rd August 2015. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all GB adults. Data were also weighted by past vote recall. Voting intention figures are calculated using the ComRes Voter Turnout Model. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
