## METHODOLOGY

ComRes interviewed 2,025 GB adults online between 10th and 11th July 2019. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all GB adults by age, gender, region and social grade. Voting intention questions were also weighted by past vote recall and likelihood to vote. All other questions were also weighted by past vote in 2016 EU Referendum. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
