Due to the urgency of the COVID-19 pandemic, developing the COVID-19 vaccine has been a priority for the healthcare sector. Despite still passing through all the regular checks and approvals, including from the UK's vaccine regulatory body, it has been developed and will be distributed faster than a traditional vaccine. To what extent are you comfortable or uncomfortable with the COVID-19 vaccine having been developed, checked and distributed at a faster pace than normal? BASE: All respondents QCPRW45Q22. The UK will now leave up to 12 weeks between the first and second doses of the Coronavirus vaccine, rather than giving both within 21 days as was originally planned. Some have expressed concerns at the delay between the two doses, with some concerns over the effectiveness of the second dose one of the UK's two approved vaccines after that period of time, as well as uncertainty regarding vaccine supply levels after a 12-week window. 
