Methodology: ComRes surveyed 2,049 British adults aged 18+ online between 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> July 2018. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all GB adults by gender, age, and region. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
