

# Independent Age – Conversations about Care

## METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 2,066 British adults online – including 116 aged 75+ – between the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> April 2016. Data were weighted to be nationally representative of British adults aged 18+. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
