METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 2,066 British adults online – including 116 aged 75+ – between the 13th and 14th April 2016. Data were weighted to be nationally representative of British adults aged 18+. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
