## METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 2,014 British adults, 1,754 of whom live in England, online between 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> February 2016. Data were weighted to be representative of all British adults aged 18+. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
