

#### States of Jersey - Voter Engagement Survey 2018

Methodology: ComRes surveyed 1,006 adults living in Jersey via telephone between 22<sup>nd</sup> August and 20<sup>th</sup> September 2018. Data were weighted by age and gender, and broadly representative by parish. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
