

LEONARD CHESHIRE DISABILITY: SURVEY OF DISABLED ADULTS: HOUSING SECTION

Methodology: ComRes interviewed 1,609 disabled adults in Great Britain aged between 18 and 65, from 15th June to 10th July 2017. Data were weighted by age, gender and region to be nationally representative of disabled adults of working age in Great Britain.
