

# LEONARD CHESHIRE DISABILITY – SOCIAL CARE SURVEY

## METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 1,032 disabled adults aged 18–65 in Great Britain online between 28<sup>th</sup> April and 10<sup>th</sup> May 2016. Data were weighted to be representative of British disabled adults by gender and region. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
