

# LEONARD CHESHIRE DISABILITY – SOCIAL CARE SURVEY

#### **METHODOLOGY NOTE**

ComRes interviewed 1,032 disabled adults aged 18–65 in Great Britain online between 28th April and 10th May 2016. Data were weighted to be representative of British disabled adults by gender and region. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
