Methodology: ComRes interviewed 250 NHS Leaders online between 22 January and 18 February 2019. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of original sample file of healthcare leaders and consultants invited to participate, by region. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.

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
