

## MANCHESTER MAYORAL AND GENERAL ELECTION SURVEY

Methodology: ComRes interviewed 1,002 adults in Greater Manchester aged 18+ online between the 18<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> April 2017. Data are weighted by age, gender, socio-economic grade and region to be representative of all adults in Greater Manchester aged 18+. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
