

Hospice UK, Dying to be heard, Public Opinion Survey – 29th January 2020

Methodology: Savanta ComRes interviewed 2,039 adults in Great Britain online from the 22nd to 23rd January 2020. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of adults in Great Britain by age, gender, region and social grade.
