Methodology: ComRes interviewed 2,017 British adults online between 10th and 16th February 2017. Data were weighted to by age, gender, region and socio-economic grade to be representative of all British adults. All adults with children aged 0–18 were included as a sub-sample referred to as “parents”.
