## METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 2,063 GB adults online between 1<sup>st</sup> July and 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2016. Of this group, 482 were parents of children aged 18 and under. Overall data were weighted to be representative of all GB adults aged 18+.
