METHODOLOGY NOTE

ComRes interviewed 1,687 GB adults aged 31 and over online between 2nd and 4th October 2015. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all GB adults aged 18+, with respondents aged 18–30 filtered out. ComRes is a member of the British Polling Council and abides by its rules.
